



## Delivered Terms

### 4 DDP – Delivered duty paid (named place)

The seller has to bear all the costs and risks needed to bring the goods to a specific point of destiny.

The seller has fulfilled his obligations when the goods have been made available at the named point and place.

The seller bears the risks and costs including duties, taxes and other charges of delivering the goods.

If the parties wish to exclude from the seller's obligations some of the costs payable on moving the goods (such as CESS) this should be made clear by adding the words Delivered duty paid, CESS unpaid (named place).

The seller's risk on the goods ends when the goods are delivered to the destination point. The buyer's risks on the goods starts when the goods arrive at destination.

Proof of delivery is generally considered to be either a weighbridge document at destination, or a tally of bags unloaded.

<b>The Seller must;</b>	<b>The Buyer must;</b>
Provide goods in conformity with the contract	Pay the price stipulated in the contract
Transport the goods to the point of destination	
Pay all taxes, duties and other charges incurred on the cargo (including CESS, VAT etc)	

The seller's risk on the goods ends when the goods are delivered to the destination point. The buyer's risks on the goods starts when the goods arrive at destination.

Proof of delivery is generally considered to be either a weighbridge document at destination, or a tally of bags unloaded.
